






Situation in Austria

- Since June 2015 **77 LAGs** in Austria working with **LEADER (EAFRD)** to realize their regional development strategy
 - In addition the 8 LAGs in Tyrol work with CLLD - ERDF
 - Out of this 8 LAGS, 4 LAGS work with CLLD-ERDF - CBC together with 6 LAGs in Italy an one swiss region.




















CBC CLLD at cross border level

One Stop shop philosophy in Tyrol

CLLD-multifonds (3 EU programms + 2 initiatives of the province Tyrol)

-EAFRD - LEADER 26 Mio. Euro

-ERDF – IGD 8 Mio. Euro

-ERDF - CBC 5 Mio. Euro

-Focus on voluntary work 2 Mio. Euro

-Regional economic program 19 Mio. Euro

Summe 60 Mio. Euro

On average 7,5 Mio. funding per region (for 7 years) directly managed by the regions.


















LEADER/ CLLD Model in Tyrol



Main values and challenges

Values

- Decision-making responsibility at local level
- One Region One Strategy One Structure ONE STOP SHOP at regional and state level
- Consistency of the "strategy hierarchy" (europe/ state / province / district)
- Reducing administrative burdens and increasing available resources
- More powerful through close cooperation between province and region

 e.g. adaption to climate change

• > bigger variety of projects, integrated regional development











Main values and challenges

Challenges

Province level

- •governance with different stakeholders on national level (explanation: due to the fact, that we are the only Region in Austria using CLLD)
- •streamlining CLLD with national and regional funds (coordination versus demarcation for example LAG Manager has to work only for LAG thus not able to coordinate also the national programme RWP)
- functional areas versus LAG boundries (example: SAR)

<u>Local level</u>

- mixing up publicity regulations
- •helping the LAG board members understand the new emerging structures
